Presidents Message

Greetings fellow Blackhawk members,

I realize it has been a long time since the club has had any communications or published a newsletter and I apologize. We hope to get back on track now that things are getting to be a little more normal and it's now time to get the boats ready as we have several events scheduled for this summer and they are all geared towards using your boats.



The first event of the year will be a lower Fox River (Illinois) cruise and lunch. (Fox Waterway stickers required). The date is Saturday June 5th with a rain date of Saturday June 12th. The tentative plan is to meet just south of the McHenry locks and cruise 17 miles south to Algonquin turn around and head back north to the Broken Oar Bar / Marina. They have parking off of the river in a no wake channel so the boats should be protected from the wakes. We will then have lunch (your own tab) and after that you are free to cruise the river. Additional information regarding times, launch ramps and the exact starting point will be sent out via email soon.

In mid-July, we will also be having the Fox Lake boat show at Famous Freddie's. We are waiting for approval from Freddie's but we are planning a similar format as before. Please keep a lookout for emails as soon as things are finalized.

In late August, we are also working on a Chicago Riverwalk boat show along with several larger wood boats including the Robert Allan and a 55' Chris Craft the completed the Great Loop several years ago. You will also have a chance to take a cruise on the Chicago River. The other possible option is a boat show at the 31st Street harbor as we had a show there previously. Mike Furibondo is still working out the details and as they are finalized we will let you know.



BAMM!

OUR 1949 CHRIS CRAFT RIVIERA

It all began way back in June of 1949, my Chris Craft Riviera serial # R18-015 was built and was delivered to Hewes Boat Company in Fox Lake Illinois.





Fast forward to 2006...

I didn't know my neighbor too well except for the occasional hello and conversations outside and had no idea he owned the boat. I had some cash in the house and went over to see him and it turns out he was getting ready to strip the boat of the hardware and sell on E-Bay, so, \$500 later and the boat was mine.

Finally, after owning the Riviera for 7 years, into the garage it went. The boat was completely stripped of all planking and the frames and chines were repaired as needed. This was not fun as some genius decided to cover the bottom of the boat with fiberglass- a huge no-no. These planks were marked and kept for use as templates for the new planking.





In the meantime, I had gotten myself a copy of "How to Restore you Wooden Runabout" by Don Dannenberg (he even signed my book) and joined his online forum. In my opinion this is a must have for anyone that is going to attempt a boat restoration.



After the frames were taken care of the next part of the restoration was the bottom. A big thank you to my dad and my wife Amy (she was even helping steam bend the planks and cutting bungs) when doing the bottom. After many hours of cutting and fitting planks, drilling holes, putting in thousands of screws – oh and a lot of 3M 5200 adhesive that gets all over and doesn't come off, the bottom was done.





Then there is a ton of shaping and sanding to come. Lots of sanding finally complete and it was time for several barrier coats of primer and several coats of Copper Bronze paint.



Next came the sides of the boat. After cutting out some rough planks from the templates, I used the router method to fit the planks. This saved countless hours of fitting using a plane. Many clamps, holes, screws, 3M 5200 and many hours in the garage, the side planks were on. Finally, time to flip the boat. This was not a big deal as I had some pulleys and straps set up in the garage and I was able to flip it by myself.





Now that it's flipped, time for the fitting the covering boards to be fitted. This took a while as I was using 2-1/2" mahogany (expensive) that was eventually planed and sanded to form the smooth rounded edge around the boat. Time for the topside planks. The entire top of the boat is planked with wood from one tree and they are also book matched. Oh, forgot to mention, along with all the screws and holes, bungs had to be cut as well to fill all those holes. The bungs that were cut were cut from the same plank that they were being put in to help match grain and color. Finally, the home stretch with putting in all these screws and bungs.



Now some coats of varnish go on the bleached areas to seal the wood. Lots of coats to put on and oh, more sanding.





Now time to install the engine. For the first time in $6 \frac{1}{2}$ years the boat got put on the trailer and taken out of the garage over to my dad's house to put the engine in.

Now the real fun begins, sanding, sanding and more sanding and when you think you are done, more sanding. Now that all the sanding is done (hope so) it is time to bleach the wood in the areas that need to be blonde. After bleaching is done the wood is white as a ghost.



After 16 coats of varnish and sanding – I said that's it and while all this was going on, I rebuilt the 105 hp KL engine for the boat and test ran it for about an hour.





Now finally time to put the chrome on, NOW it looks like a wood boat is supposed to! By the way, the last chrome was being put on several days before the 2019 Geneva lakes Boat Show.

After that, many hours of putting in all the wiring, gauges and other controls, it was time to put in the interior. I purchased the kit from Jack Mayeaux out in Washington State. Jack has done numerous interiors on Concours winning boats at Lake Tahoe.



I did not have any time left to do ANY sea trials and was forced to splash the boat at the Abbey for the first time in 34 years, the day before the show! Luckily, there were no issues with the boat and it got used several times at the show.





Thank you to all the Captains who voted my Riviera as the best Classic Runabout and Captain's Choice awards.

A big thank you to Tom Wagner of Fox River Valley Boats for his guidance and support and also Don Dannenberg and his loyal followers on his website forum as without their support and knowledge the restoration would have never happened.

To my wife Amy, a huge thank you for putting up with me disappearing for hours at a time in the garage or basement and in honor of our family, the boats name is: BAMM! - Bob, Amy, Michael and Mitchel.
