



Blackhawk members will recall that Toby Lindo established Chicago Maritime Arts Center in 2017 to bring Chicago kids to the water and to boating. Programs last year included boat-building classes in partnership with the Chicago Park District, the Jackson Park Yacht Clubs and the Carpenters Union. The highlight for each class was launch day. For many kids this was their first time on the water. Thirty-five boys and girls participated in classes last year and as you can see there were many happy campers.

CMAC celebrated its first full year of operation at the Lagunitas Brewery on November 27, with over 150 attending including Blackhawk members Ted Cartner, Terry Dickson and Glen Steinberg. CMAC secured over \$12,000 in donations that evening to support boat-building programs for 2019.

The Blackhawk Chapter has made a contribution to the CMAC for tuition to make it possible for two Chicago kids to attend boat-building classes this summer.



Blackhawk members are also invited to join CMAC and Howard Rice on the evening of Thursday, May 16 at the Chicago Yacht Club. Howard will be the featured speaker and will share his experience of more than two decades in Micronesia with descendants of the people who discovered and settled many of the Pacific Ocean islands more than a thousand years ago.

Howard began his journey in 2017 sailing into the Straits of Magellan (and back out again thankfully). He will continue his journey this summer cruising from Portsmouth, England through the North Sea. Howard is live-streaming his journey to classrooms around the world at no charge as a way to share his adventures with kids and to show them they don't need to spend a fortune to have a boat of their own.



The evening will be a kick-off dinner for the boating season in Chicago and will be a chance to enjoy a night at the Chicago Yacht Club's Monroe Harbor Station.

CMAC Plans for 2019

This year, we started our first class Tuesday, March 26 at Eleanor Street Boathouse on the Chicago River (Park District location).

We will begin our first in-school class with 25 kids at the Urban Prairie Waldorf School in May, followed by summer boat-building classes in Jackson Park and at the Carpenters Union Training Center.

And we host our first North side class in July at the Chicago Sailing Center on Elston Avenue. We are also adding a one-week boating skills and marine ecology program at Jackson Park for 16 kids.

CMAC is also participating for the first time with Friends of the River in its annual River Clean-up day on Saturday, May 11 at the Canal Street Yard from 9-12. CMAC will launch its fleet of skiffs to pick up debris along the banks of the South Branch of the river adjacent to the Canal Street yard and the Chinatown Park.

Our group will also host 100 Chicago kids at the Columbia Yacht Club on May 15 where they will learn about sail training programs, see a demonstration of boat-building and hear from Howard Rice who is making his way around the watery parts of the world in his 12' yawl SOUTHERN CROSS.
