The Blackhawk Chapter, featuring Lars Bergersen, will be holding a workshop at Bergersen Boat Co.



Junior Blackhawks Update

Catching-up with Drew

Since the last time that I was able to attend a Blackhawk Chapter event, I have been quite busy at college. For those who do not know, in the spring of 2014 I was accepted into the Webb Institute of Naval Architecture in Glen Cove, New York. This school is highly respected in the maritime industry and I am so fortunate to have been accepted into their program. I am on track to graduate in the spring of 2018 and when finished, I will be heading straight to work in the marine industry.

If you were not aware, Webb Institute is home to just 90 undergraduate students. The school provides each scholar a bachelor's degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering after four years of study. With this degree, I will be able to design hull forms for ships of all shapes and sizes, and outfit them with the appropriate machinery. The program here at Webb is unlike any other and has provided me so many experiences already, a few of which I would like to share with you.

At Webb, I am exposed to a plethora of opportunities, each one providing some benefit to my education. Every year, during the months of January and February, the school requires every student to complete what we refer to as a Winter Work Term. These work terms provide students with substantial experience in the industry that give us an advantage when applying for jobs at the end of our four years. As freshman, students work in a shipyard doing hands-on labor and understanding just how hard it is to build a ship from the documents provided by us engineers. As sophomores, students spend time at sea working on commercial ships all over the world. During the Junior/Senior year work terms, students apply for internships at actual design firms where they might be interested in working. As a second semester sophomore, I have completed the first two of these Winter Work Terms.

During my freshman year Winter Work Term, I worked for Marinette Marine Corporation in Marinette, Wisconsin. At this yard, I was employed as the supervisor of compartment closeout for LCS-9 (Littoral Combat Ship #9). It was quite the experience as I was in charge of inspecting individual compartments (rooms) on the ship and ensuring they were complete before the Navy arrived for final inspection. It was a valuable experience as I became quite aware of the obvious separation between manufacturing and engineering in the ship building industry.





As a sophomore, this year, I went to sea for my Winter Work Term. On January 1st, 2016 I boarded the Maran Gas *Al Jassasiya* in Zeebrugge, Belgium. The *Al Jassasiya* is a 900-foot-long liquefied natural gas (LNG) tanker. During the course of this term I sailed from Belgium, to Ras Laffan Qatar (through the Suez Canal), and then back to Rovigo, Italy where we disembarked on February 13th, 2016. During the first week on board we experienced the effects of a Sea State 9 condition (12 is a hurricane).

We made it through the storm without injury, but the ship did sustain damage (mostly due to shifting equipment). My duties were limited, given my lack of experience, but I kept busy with the massive project provided by my school. It was definitely quite the opportunity to be aboard a ship and observe its operation in all sorts of conditions. Life at school is quite stressful most of the time, but as Tom Wagner always used to tell me, "If it were easy, everyone would do it." The workload is heavy, and the pace is fast. In a normal week, I will spend roughly 70 hours doing homework. Somehow outside of all the classes, homework, and sports, I still find time to work on various carpentry jobs around campus. I do not plan to go into the wooden boat industry, but I will never lose the passion I have for doing a little woodwork every once in a while.

On a side note, during my first month at school, we were split into groups and given materials to build sailboats. With my wood working experience, and the help of my partner who was on the US Sailing Team, our team crushed the competition. We not only placed first in the race, but we also were the only boat to sail the course in its entirety, without having to paddle.

Though I have been here for over a year and a half, I feel as if it were just the blink of an eye. I hope to attend the Tall Ships show with my parents this summer and I cannot wait to share my stories with you all there. I miss everyone from the Blackhawk Chapter so much and I look forward to seeing you all very soon.

THE LURE OF THE LAND OF LAKES

40TH ACBS ANNUAL MEETING AND INTERNATIONAL BOAT SHOW 2015 GULL LAKE, MINNESOTA

Mary and I took the long drive up to Nisswa from Chicago for the BSLOL ACBS International Show on Gull Lake. As we crossed the bridge over Gull Lake, and saw the warm neon lights of the historic Bar Harbor Super Club glowing in the distance, I knew immediately that this is my kind of place and we would surely have a great time in the Land of the Lakes.

We put lots of work in on our boat over the summer and were not sure to have it ready for the show. Then I didn't get registered in time for the pre-events or to show her in the water. Even with the last minute planning we arrived on Wednesday evening just in time to crash the ACBS Welcome Aboard Reception at the Supper Club. The Gull Dam beer was cold and the walleye was superb.

The show set-up was in full swing early Thursday morning under overcast skies and some drizzle. This gave me the opportunity to see some of the boats up close and get some good shots before the show officially opened on Friday and the spectators lined the docks.

I realized immediately as I stepped out on the beautiful docks of Bar Harbor that this was a gathering of the most diverse and eclectic display of classic boats I have ever had the privilege to see.





1929 36' Bell Labs Limousine "Tolka", This outstanding historic boat was built at Alexander Graham Bell Laboratories in Nova Scotia. It was found abandoned in the woods of Muskoka Ontario in 2005 and restored by Peter Breen for Lee Anderson and won Gold in the Launch Category.

Another beauty is Jane Larson's very original 1959 Cruisers Inc. Commander with 59 Merc Mark 78A and is appropriately named 'Buster'.



Del VanEmmerick's sweet 1959 CarAqua with twin 45 HP Scott-Atwater motors is scoring points with judges and won Gold in the Outboard Category.



Our friend Jerry Peterson aboard his "Swingin' Shepherd", a beautiful 1954 Shepherd powered by a 220 HP Chrysler Marine Hemi.



The "Bar Harbor Clipper" (right) was launched on Gull Lake in May of 1938. The nifty 26' Chris Craft-Clipper provided "Captains Service" to guests at Gull Lake resorts for an evening of Cocktails & Dining by Candlelight and dancing in the moonlight at the magnificent Bar Harbor Night Club . The boats whereabouts is now unknown but was near identical to the Clipper "Klondike" seen below.





One of my favorites was this all original 1930 hand built powered by a rare 1930 Johnson P50 20HP. Blake is an authority on the history of the boat which was a barn find scratch built by Glen Bucks from Glencoe MN. Blake said it was patterned after the "Baby Gar" and she won OB Gold.



Paul and Bobbi Anderson brought 'Klondike' all the way over from CA. We saw this 1938 25' Chris-Craft Clipper at the Geneva Lakes International Show in 2011 where she was awarded Best of Show. Here Klondike won that same prestigious award, Best of Show Restored.



Fridays treat was a beautiful fall morning with warm sunlight breaking through the clouds and spectacular classic wood, glass and metal boats filling the harbor.



We also did some cruising with friends Bill and Nancy Anderson and the crowd pleasing 1958 15' Barnes Shark with 75 HP Hiawatha. Won Outboard category Platinum.



1961 21' Chris-Craft Continental Hardtop "Fin & Tonic" Derk Brill took home Classic Utility Preserved Platinum.



I finally had the opportunity to meet the renowned ThompsonboatMan Andre Jordahl Rhude with his great 1955 Thompson Thomboy 'Thommy' with Johnson 35.



Will Vidal filling in as mate aboard his 'In the Mood' 1940 22' Chris-Craft Sportsman on Gull Lake. Won Antique Utility Restored Silver.



1961 21' Chris-Craft Continental Hardtop "Over the Top" These fabulous fins won Classic Utility Restored Gold.



'Evangline', this 1924 33' HackerCraft was built for Henry Ford and is powered by the Ford Liberty 450 HP V-12. Did I mention metal boats? Fred Bursch's 'War Canoe' is a very rare 1955 AlumnaCraft M16 powered by a Crosley 30 HP with an Aero-Jet V-Drive.



Tom and Jennifer relax aboard 'Roamer', a 1920 33' semi-enclosed launch built by Jos. Dingle Boat Works in St. Paul MN. The boat originally was an open launch and the cabin was added by Dingle in 1934 and also repowered at that time with the existing Universal 45 HP 6cyl motor. Tom bought Roamer in 1959 and she continues to ply the waters of Cass Lake MN as she has for over 90 years.

Dean Kent's 1949 Chris Craft Sportsman 'Dutchess' was originally a Lake Geneva Boat. The boat was his grandfathers and he is planning to bring it up to the Abbey in September.



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
