

sociation, which provided a great opportunity to meet up with old friends and make new ones.

Many of the boaters, representing Blackhawk, Glacier Lakes, MPBA and Century Boat Club closed out the night (and Sat night too) at the Holiday Inn Bar.

Saturday morning found the Friday launchers drying down their soggy boats, while the more sane ones launched in the bright sun on Saturday morning. Even so, the strong wind and stronger currents at the ramp made this less than a cake walk.

There were plenty of exercise opportunities if you wanted to see it all. The festivities took up most of the Riverfront Park, with the in-water woodies (and classic glass) at the far north end. Walking south from there were the on-land boat displays, swap meet and vendors, food concessions, race boat displays, and race boat pits. When the race boats were off the course, the pits were opened to the public and the drivers were on hand to sign autographs for fans. Further down were the car show, motorcycle show, model displays and more. Several times over the weekend a nitro fueled dragster was fired up to add to the auditory stimulus. There was also a record breaking semi tractor on hand.

The race course was a 1.5 mile oval right off shore from the park, and at times it seemed the racers might actually come ashore, the action was so close. Saturday's test and tune sessions were a little sparse as some of the racers may have been concerned with the very strong crosswind blowing all day. Even so the action was terrific and the sound was awesome. Sunday's weather was perfect and the racers really turned it up. There are some great shots on the website at Muscatineboatshow.com.

The cardboard boat racers took their turn in between test and tune sessions on Saturday. Various intrepid souls braved the course which was shortened due to the wind. Even so, the end of many runs against the clock was a soaking in the very chilly water.

When the racers, both motorized and cardboard were off the course, the river was opened up for general boating, and the classic pleasure craft took full advantage of these opportunities. It was hard to resist the urge to take a lap or two around the race course, although it seemed to take forever after watching the hydros cutting hot laps. I may be biased, but the sound was just as cool, only not as loud. Several groups of boats went upriver through the locks, or downriver to see the sights.

In addition to the Friday hog roast, breakfasts and Saturday's dinner were also provided to the boaters, courtesy of various sponsors. Saturday night the street was closed off









for a Rock & Roll street dance and beer fest.

There were about 20 classic boats in the water and another 50 or so on land. Including all the vintage and modern race boats, the total was around 140 registered boats. Century boats made a particularly strong showing as the Century Boat Club tied in their annual roundup with the festivities. Some Century owners came from as far as Pennsylvania for this.

An interesting side note is that the Mississippi River runs to the West at Muscatine, and the sunsets are renowned. Unfortunately, we did not see one. We did however, see the Muscatine bridge all lit up at night, the only bridge in the US with lights that change colors, provided by a local company.



2009 Geneva Lakes Antique and Classic Boat Show September 25-27



Please come to the 10th annual 2009 Geneva Lakes Antique and Classic Boat Show. The boat show is once again being held at the Abbey Resort & Spa in Fontana, WI, and promises to be a great event.

The weekend begins Friday morning at 9:00 am with a narrated lake front estate garden tour. Boaters will be inspired by the spectacular gardens at the lake.

A "Classic Picnic Buffet" will be served at Aurora University in the Village of Williams Bay at 1:15 pm. The Menu includes; Black Angus Burgers, All Beef Hot Dogs, Cole Slaw, Backed beans, Watermelon & Cookies.

Feel free to come to Aurora University by boat or car starting at 12:00 pm. Cash bar will be available. The highlight of the afternoon is a tour of the historic Yerkes Observatory! The tour is from 2:00 pm-3:00 pm. A trolley will shuttle from Aurora University to Yerkes leaving at 1:45 pm and arriving back at Aurora University at 3:15. Total cost for lunch, shuttle and tour is \$35.00 per person.

Yerkes Observatory, which calls itself "the birthplace of modern astrophysics," is an astronomical observatory operated by the University of Chicago in Williams Bay. It was created in 1897 by George Ellery Hale and financed by Charles T. Yerkes. The observatory represented a shift in the thinking of observatories, from mere housing for a telescope and observer, to the modern concept of observation equipment integrated with laboratory space for physics and chemistry. A 102 cm (40 inch) refracting telescope is located inside. It is



the largest refracting telescope used for scientific research. For more information on the observatory visit their web site at http://astro.uchicago.edu/yerkes.

Come join us on Friday evening at Gordy's Boat House Restaurant upstairs in the legendary Cobalt Lounge. Cash bar will open at 6:00 and be open all night. Dinner is "on your own"; Gordy's wait staff will take dinner orders in the lounge starting at 7:00 pm. Separate checks will be available. Boat docking is available. Entertainment will be provided by the Laura Bayliss Jazz Trio.

Boats will be on exhibit all day Saturday, beginning at 10:00 am. Be sure you have your boat in the water by then, as we expect a lot of spectators. Local vendors will have items on display, and the Blackhawk Chapter's tent will once again offer t-shirts, posters and other items. The annual "starting of the engines" and boat parade will commence at 4:00 pm. "Burnin' Down The Docks", a celebration of Blues, will be playing live at the waterfront from 12:00-4:00 both Saturday and Sunday.

Saturday evening's dinner will be held at the Shore Room in the Abbey Resort. Cash bar will open at 6:30, followed by a sit-down dinner of chicken or beef. Cost is \$40 per person. This is an event you won't want to miss, as boat show awards will be presented at Saturday evening's dinner. Awards will be given in several categories including: Best Chris Craft; Best Century; Best Runabout; Best Utility; Best Outboard Boat; Best Fiberglass Classic, the "Best of Show"; and, of course, the Blackhawk Sharpest Arrow Award.






