


Geneva Lake Estate Tour by Jan Vogeler

Every year I look forward to Blackhawk Chapter hosting the ACBS Geneva Lakes Boat Show. We have been fortunate enough to attend the show for the last 7 years. Most definitely though one of the highlights of the show is the Estate Tour that kicks off our grand weekend. Please allow me to recap my privileged experience through these homes. As I was fortunate enough to act as tour guide on the first launch, some of my words may be taken from a script that was so graciously provided by Larry Larkin.



Our tour began with an intriguing fog that allowed us to see our Captain Larry Larkin using his masterful skills in navigating to our first location. Slow and steady was our pace.

Thanks to our Captain, we arrived safely at the home of Jerry Newton and David Weinberg where we were greeted at the dock by Mr. Weinberg himself. The home was designed in what could be called "Modern Mediterranean" style. Following retirement from his first career, Mr. Weinberg began his second career in artistic photography. His photographs, described as "modern contemporary", create a photographic narrative telling a story, more graphic and less abstract than what is usually considered Modern Art. As scripted, the home was designed with strong vertical lines and abundant windows on the exterior, and thoughtfully placed interior open spaces. The home was furnished with many paintings and sculptures that Mr. Weinberg has collected throughout the years. Our gracious host captivated all of us as he shared the passion of his interests. Many thanks to Jerry Newton and David Weinberg for sharing your beautiful home!

After another relaxing ride, our second launch took us to the home of Christie and Sam Eddins. Disembarking the launch, we gathered up the stairs and around a traditional southern Carolina Kettle. In the 19th century, pots such as this were used in making syrup. We were told by our hostess (Sue Larkin) that these pots were made of cast-iron and needed to be oiled in order to maintain their good condition. Their usefulness was not only for cooking hot dogs and roasting marshmallows for s'mores, but more extensive cooking could be done by placing an oyster roasting surface on the top. It was mentioned that the Eddins' family likes to end their day by gathering around a bright and cheery fire while enjoying their lake view.





Throughout the home there was a recurring design theme of Xs. Whether they were in the ceiling, or in the floor, it was fun to try and locate all of them in each room. Going thru each room was a treat. Colors and themes were extremely well chosen and were so complimentary of a lake home. One particular theme I personally enjoyed, were the cows. Being from WI, I found the faces to be very fun and exciting. Thank you Mr. and Mrs. Eddins for sharing your wonderful sunny new home on Lake Geneva!



In 1921, the estate was sold to O.N. Tevander. He was the inventor of what was known at that time as the "sanitary milk bottle cap". In 1965 the estate was purchased by the Wrigley family, and is occupied by the three Hagenah brothers, 4th generation descendants of William Wrigley Jr., founder of the Wrigley chewing gum company.

While there were many buildings on the property, we toured only the summer residence of Phil and Susan Hagenah. Their home was designed by Phil's brother John, and built just four years ago. Most of the features and details of this house are based on magazine clippings and photographs collected by Susan.





The third launch took us to the Hagenah Compound. This compound consists of 16 acres of land, with a half-dozen buildings on the north shore of Lake Geneva. First purchased in 1876 by General Henry Strong (who was the president of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad) after he had camped all around the lake for several years before declaring that this was the "finest property on the lake shore".



Our hosts described their home with these words: "What we wanted was a great, old, lake house". Phil and Susan took us through their gorgeously warm home, and shared with us the features that made it truly unique. Our appreciation and thanks to Phil and Susan Hagenah for the historical background and charming tour of your delightful home.

Our final destination was the Lake Geneva Country Club for a luncheon. As always the food and staff were fabulous! Again, we thank our hosts and their willingness to allow us to enter their homes. Without them, this memorable day would not be possible. See you next year!!

Starting off the competition a 1947 Chris Craft Sportsman "Big W" owned by Mike & Linda Stolz and Tom & Debbi Bosworth flew by as they proceeded down the lake.

Next up was a large cruiser 1951 Chris Craft Super Deluxe Semi Enclosed - 'Chrysalis' captained by Ted Cartner. After Ted's two fly-by's at close range those onboard Svoboda's Century started questioning the sanity of the competition.

I skillfully stayed on my feet as the boat rocked back in forth just in time to see the cup "rolleth over" the edge of the boat into the clear, dark blue waters. I felt like the elderly woman watching the jewel disappear into the ocean at the end of the Titanic movie.

Needless to say the judging abruptly ended with Mark Svoboda's fitting comment "you lost the fing Cup!!!" Steve Fleming kept repeating "I can't believe it".

Dave Vogeler was deemed the winner and presented at the Awards Banquet a fine "MacGyver" replacement trophy....a chrome coffee table borrowed from the halls of the Abbey Resort along with my room's ice bucket.

Now for the rest of the story.


