### BLACKHAWK CHAPTER 2018 Geneva Lakes Boat Show Lake Cruise, Estate Tour and Welcome Dinner Contributed by the 2018 GLBS Committee

The 2018 Geneva Lakes Boat Show Friday estate tour was a fantastic opportunity to kick off a wonderful classic boating weekend. With three picturesque estates, transportation on classic lake launches and lunch at the Lake Geneva Yacht Club there is no better supporting event!



The first home visited was the residence of Tom and Geri Whowell. This amazing home sits on 12 wooded acres and took ten years to build, fifty years of collecting Indian, lake, and nautical memorabilia to reach the point you will see today. The home is a 6500 sq. ft. of post and beam construction with 36 6 by 8-foot picture windows. There is no drywall, wallpaper, paint, or sealer inside or out on this house. Many tons of granite boulders line the perimeter and it has many unique architectural features including a wooden bath tub and sink.

Our next stop was the home of Michael and Marie Keefe. This remarkable home, designed by architect Justin Bucy of BSB Design and built by contractor John Engerman, is modern in every respect with crisp clean lines while maintaining a warm inviting feel. It is based on the philosophy expressed by Louis Sullivan that artistic "form follows function," with a blend in this case of modern contemporary living while exploiting remarkable views focusing on the lake. The extraordinary steel structure that supports the house and cantilevered balconies on the steep hillside is cleverly worked into wooden floors and wall panels that are hand rubbed to bring out the natural warmth of the wood.



The third home on the 2018 tour was House in the Woods, owned by a Blackhawk member. This home is truly amazing and is among the finest on the lake. It is the result of a harmony of design and decoration throughout the home that subtly blends into a decorative masterpiece. It was designed by Howard VanDoren Shaw and built in 1905 by Adolphus Bartlett a partner of Hibbard, Spencer and Bartlett Hardware Company that eventually became True Value Hardware. It was a gift for his wife and was built under a circus tent so work could progress throughout the winter without interruption.



After seeing the main house, guests had the opportunity to see the swimming pool and the guest house. The home was honored by Ladies Home Journal as being among the twelve best summer homes in the country, and another national magazine described it as "one of the most beautiful country homes in the land." The Bartlett's art collection, which was given to the art Institute, included Seurat's La Grande Jatte and Van Goghs' Bedroom at Arles, among many other prized gifts.

Our final stop was the Lake Geneva Yacht Club and Buddy Melges Sailing Center for lunch. As many of you know, Buddy Melges was an Olympic Gold Medalist and the helmsman on the America<sup>3</sup> when it won the America's Cup. We chose to go to the Yacht Club this year to give our membership and guests an opportunity to see this new and interesting facility. Our group had the opportunity to walk around inside the building and see the pictures and the memorabilia from earlier historic yachting events.

### Boats used for transportation the 2018 Estate Tour



**SEALARK**: Owned by Larry Larkin, completed in 2006, is a re-creation of an 1890's historic Lake Geneva steam yacht. Although powered by a modern Crusader 8.1 liter V-8 engine, the boat captures the essence of the earliest boats on Lake Geneva.

**POLARIS:** This 73-foot long craft owned by Gage Marine was built in 1898 by the Racine Boat Manufacturing Company and brought to Lake Geneva by rail car. It was owned by Otto Young, a wholesale jeweler and

land speculator who also built Stone Manor. Purchased in 1940 by the tour boat company it has been used as a charter boat for the last 80 years.





**HENRY KNOX:** Owned by a Blackhawk member, this 88-foot vessel was just completed and launched on June 9, 2018. Designed by Mark Pudlo of Seacraft Design, hull built by Andersen Boat Works, Styled by Bill Prince, decorated by Alessandra Branca the yacht is simply outstanding in every respect with exquisite veneers, specially selected fabrics, and craftsmanship of the highest quality. Its mechanical equipment is equally sophisticated. It is battery powered with twin Torqeedo electric motors for propulsion, a Seakeeper gyro stabilizer, and B & G Marine Electronics.

The 2018 Geneva Lakes Boat Show Welcome Dinner was held at Michael Ferro's Apple Orchard and Entertainment Center. ### 26th ANNUAL MINOCQUA ANTIQUE & CLASSIC BOAT SHOW HOSTED AT THE BOATHOUSE ON LAKE MINOCQUA June 22-23 2018 Benefiting the Multiple Sclerosis Society A Special Salute to Captain Gordon Moore "Our Founder"

At the 2017 Minocqua Antique and Classic Boat Show, show participants and viewing public endured cold, windy and overcast conditions. Gordon Moore, the show's founder and guiding spirit, promised ideal weather conditions for the 2018 show.

Sadly, 2 months after the 2017 show, Gordon passed away. Gordon's passing left a void in the Northwoods antique boating community. Boaters were determined to make the 26th Annual Minocqua Antique & Classic Boat show a tribute to Gordon Moore.

However during the week leading up to the 2018 show, the Northwoods experienced record rainfalls. Several areas south of Minocqua were flooding, thus the DNR was unable to lower the Lake Minocqua water levels. Two days before the show was to begin, water was lapping over the docks at the show venue—The Boathouse.

Show promoter—Al Hanley, considered canceling the show. **But**, on Thursday the lake level dropped a couple of inches, and then again on Friday. Al declared the show "**a go**"! But out of caution for protecting the boats, the Friday evening boat parade was canceled.

On Saturday morning, 47 show participants were greeted by a spectacularly sunny day. The temperature was in the low 80s with a light breeze. The Minocqua Show was held in the best conditions that anyone could recall.

The docks and the land display were filled with a wide variety of beautiful antique and classic boats. Spectators crowded the docks and all enjoyed the outside dining and music.

For 26 years all proceeds from the Minocqua show have been donated to the Multiple Sclerosis Society. The show this year raised over \$5,0000.

All agreed that Gordon Moore had kept his promise.






