Considering that all the local bodies of water were at record flood levels, there was little chance of getting an early start on the boating season. So if you can't go boating, the next best thing is to look at boats and talk boats - and what better place to do so than a boat restoration shop.

Lars and the crew at Bergersen Boat Company hosted about 50 Blackhawk members and guests for an informative morning of all things woodie. With the sun (finally) shining brightly, the boats out in the yard could be uncovered, so there was a lot to see, even before going into the shops.



Coffee and treats were set out in the finishing shop, where the smell of fresh varnish told us we were in the right place. Five boats were in the shop, at various stages of finishing. In addition, there was a skeleton that we later learned was an original design that Lars was working on in his "spare time".

After everyone had a chance to wander around and take in the sights, President Mark Svoboda briefly called an informal meeting to order. He provided updates on several of the coming events planned for this season, and summarized some of the results of the recent Directors meeting. Lars welcomed all the visitors to his business, and gave a quick rundown of what he had set up for us to see. Outside the wood shop, he had set up a demonstration of steam bending, with a steam box and bending jig in operation. Inside, there were several boats undergoing various degrees of restoration, with the most drastic being a keel replacement. Lars demonstrated the technique of planing the new keel to get the proper angles, and discussed boring the shaft hole. He answered questions on a number of topics. Nearby one of his crew gave a demonstration of riveting, allowing some of the audience to try their hand at it.

The Bergersen crew laid out a delicious lunch of pulled pork and sub sandwiches with all the trimmings for the guests to enjoy while they moved between the various shop areas. All too soon it was time for us to head back home and check on our sump pumps.

Thanks to Lars and Olivia Bergersen and all of the folks at Bergersen Boat Company for sharing a very enjoyable and educational morning with the Blackhawk Chapter.
