

On Saturday evening we had 32 members and guests at the Chicago Yacht Club dinner. The weather cleared and we enjoyed a beautiful evening and a picturesque view of the Chicago harbor and skyline. I would like to thank each and every member that participated in the show. Your dedication to the Blackhawk Chapter is greatly appreciated.

Our next event is the Chain O'Lakes Show on Saturday July 20th at Famous Freddie's on Pistakee Lake. The show runs from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM with an awards presentation at 1:30 PM. A barbeque buffet will follow at 2:00 PM. This is always a fun event and attracts a wide variety of antique and classic boats from the area. Chicago In-Water Boat Show

The in-water boat show at the new 31st Street Marina was certainly a different venue than our typical ACBS show. There were venders selling everything from \$2,000,000 yachts to jars of pickles. For \$43,000 you could buy the new aqua-ATV, similar to the classic AquaCar but a combo Jet ski/ATV. One of the more interesting new gadgets was a Flyboard, a kit that attaches to a Jet Ski, diverts the water through a 6" diameter 50' long hose to a small platform that you attach to your feet. The water exits through two jets under the platform thrusting the rider up into the air. On pages 1, 8 and 9 you can see photos of them, as well as the agua ATV and some other fun water toys that were available at "Try-it Cove", right there in the harbor next to where our boats were docked.

The weather varied quite a bit over the 5 days of the show. Set up Wednesday was hot, humid, & very windy. Thursday was cool, dry, but still windy. Lake waves were 7-9 feet! Friday was sunny with moderate temps, but the morning cruise & parade were cancelled as the waves were still breaking over the seawall. On Saturday it rained on and off all day. The weather on Sunday turned out to be near perfect, with a good crowd attending the show. Lake Michigan on Sunday morning was dead calm, which gave us a chance to burn some gas in our boats while enjoying the Chicago skyline.

Of course the main attraction were the A.&C.B.s on display from the Blackhawk Chapter. We showed a variety of boats from the canoes and 17' Youth Project outboard to a beautiful 28' 1932 Garwood with a V12 Scripps. The "came the furthest by water" award goes to the Rodecks, who drove their Streblow "RODAN" down Lake Michigan to the show from Kenosha.

Sensing a need to attract more attention to the Blackhawk tent, George Plamondon took his rare 1960s BMW AQUACYCLE out of storage and drove it to the tent & put it on display. Most don't know the history of this rare, one of a kind, motorcycle. At first glance it looks like any run of the mill classic BMW with a side car. Pinewood Studios (re. 007) asked the Bavaria Motor Werks to create a special bike which had a side car that would detach when it hit the water, the motorcycle would fall away and the side car would then be a crude sort of Jet ski. But the scene never made it to the final cut as when filming, the sidecar suddenly submarined and almost drown the stuntman. George declined to demonstrate.

The dinner Saturday evening at the Chicago Yacht Club was indeed a special venue. The view from the second floor dinning room overlooking the Harbor was spectacular.

By Sunday afternoon most were tired after 4-5 days. To avoid the rush and gridlock at the 31st Street Marina ramp after the Show, there was a parade of mahogany to Burnham Harbor by water to ramp out the boats. This worked out well as the trailers were already stored at Burnham.

Upper Chain O' Lakes RENDEZVOUS!







Saturday Evening Awards Dinner




Sunday, September 29, Boat Show continues in the Abbey Harbor




