

BLACKHAWK CHAPTER 2019 Geneva Lakes Boat Show Lake Cruise, Estate Tour and Welcome Dinner

We kicked off the 2019 Geneva Lakes Boat Show on Friday morning with the Estate Tour and Luncheon. While the weather was overcast and grey, we were all excited for what the day would hold. We visited three wonderful estates that we have not visited in the past. This combined with travel aboard classic Geneva Lake launches, always makes this event the perfect opening for an antique and classic boat show weekend.



Joy Rasin's home is known as Flowerside Inn was the first property we visited. It was built in 1899 by Simeon B. Chapin, a stock broker in Chicago (later New York) and was owned by Mr. Chapin and his family until 1955. It is among the few Lake Geneva homes that still survive from the 1800's. Designed by Chicago architects Wilson and Marshall, it is a blending of American and English Country style homes and is surrounded even today by extensive gardens. The home is quite spacious with a large screened in porch, and several multipurpose rooms for dining and relaxing. The living room is 70 feet in length and 30 feet wide, and at one time housed the largest organ in Wisconsin.

Next we stopped at Al and Kathi Bosworth's new summer home located at Lake Geneva Pier #1, the consummate lake home. This property has been in the Bosworth family for three generation since his grandfather purchased it in 1953. It is filled with custom woodwork and cabinetry made by Al's company, Hire Nelson, that is remarkably detailed and finished. Interesting and unusual woods are used throughout and extensive stone work and masonry highlight the exterior and driveway. The décor is special and the result of careful and tasteful selection by Kathi. There are many special features such as a hidden passage to the lake and a garage that is specially built to hold every imaginable type of water accessory.





Finally, we visited John and Sara Cobb's recently built home in the historic Loramoor neighborhood which was designed by Chicago based Morgante Wilson and built by Matustik Builders. The home was designed to see and enjoy all of Lake Geneva with over 150 windows that creates a dazzling panorama of light while allowing guests to see all of the lake and look through the house. Family and friends were the primary vision with a master bedroom that faces the lake, a child's lakefront bedroom room with a juliette balcony and guest rooms and bunk room for all their guests. The three-story interior with the 4th level "lookout tower" also features a 40-

foot long suspended walkway at the second floor level that allows guests to see the bright, airy, modern interior and decor throughout the house. Their home focuses on family, friends, lake and comfort.




For lunch we stopped at Lake Geneva Country Club, founded in 1895, and is one of the oldest in the country. Originally laid out by the golf pro from St. Andrews in Scotland, it is steeped in tradition. The current club house built in 1915 was designed in the "prairie style" by Robert Spencer, Jr., and replaced an earlier club house destroyed by fire the year before. Lunch was served in the dining room overlooking the lake.

SEALARK: Owned by Larry Larkin, completed in 2006, is a re-creation of an 1890's historic Lake Geneva steam yacht. Although powered by a modern Crusader 8.1 liter V-8 engine, the boat captures the essence of the earliest boats on Lake Geneva.



NORMANDIE: Owned by Larry



POLARIS: This 73-foot long craft owned by Gage Marine was built in 1898 by the Racine Boat Manufacturing Company and brought to Lake Geneva by rail car. It was owned by Otto Young, a wholesale jeweler and land speculator who also built Stone Manor. Purchased

in 1940 by the tour boat company it has been used as a charter boat for the last 80 years.

We will start at 10am with Coffee and Doughnuts.



About a half a dozen Blackhawk members attended a fund raiser for the Chicago Maritime Arts Center (CMAC) this past November. CMAC is a recently formed 501c3 organization based in Chicago with the aim to help young people find themselves and new positive pathways by building boats and learning about the maritime arts and ecology.

The fundraiser was held at the Lagunitas Brewery in Chicago. The Brewery provided a large meeting room at no charge with music, food, and merriment. There were about 145 attendees. With the entrance donation and the silent auction, over \$12,000 was raised.

In 2019 over 130 young kids attended various CMAC events including 60 or so building 12 foot skiffs which they actually launched and rowed about the Chicago River.

CMAC also has marine ecology events such as river clean up days. In 2020 the aim is to double the participation.
