Joy Rasin Home



Joy Rasin's home is known as Flowerside Inn. It was built in 1899 by Simeon B. Chapin, a stock broker in Chicago (later New York) and was owned by Mr. Chapin and his family until 1955. It is among the few Lake Geneva homes that still survive from the 1800's. Designed by Chicago architects Wilson and Marshall, it is a blending of American and English Country style homes and is surrounded even today by extensive gardens. The home is quite spacious with a large screened in porch, and several multipurpose rooms for dining and relaxing. The living room is 70 feet in length and 30 feet wide, and at one time housed the largest organ in Wisconsin.

Al and Kathi Bosworth Home



Al and Kathi Bosworth's new summer home located at Lake Geneva Pier #1 is the consummate lake home. This property has been in the Bosworth family for three generations since his grandfather purchased it in 1953. It is filled with custom woodwork and cabinetry made by Al's company, Hire Nelson, that is remarkably detailed and finished. Interesting and unusual woods are used throughout and extensive stone work and masonry highlight the exterior and driveway. The décor is special and the result of careful and tasteful selection by Kathi. There are many special features such as a hidden passage to the lake and a garage that is specially built to hold every imaginable type of water accessory.

John and Sara Cobb Home

John and Sara Cobb's recently built home in the historic Loramoor neighborhood was designed by Chicago based Morgante Wilson and built by Matustik Builders. The home was designed to see and enjoy all of Lake Geneva with over 150 windows that create a dazzling panorama of light while allowing quests to see all of the lake and look through the house. Family and friends were the primary vision with a master bedroom that faces the lake, a child's lakefront bedroom room with a juliette balcony and guest rooms and bunk room for all their quests. The three-story interior with the 4th level "lookout tower" also features a 40-foot long suspended walkway at the second floor level that allows guests to see the bright, airy, modern interior and decor throughout the house. Their home focuses on family, friends, lake and comfort.



The Lake Geneva Country Club



Lake Geneva Country Club, founded in 1895, is one of the oldest in the country. Originally laid out by the golf pro from St. Andrews in Scotland, it is steeped in tradition. The current club house built in 1915 was designed in the "prairie style" by Robert Spencer, Jr., and replaced an earlier club house destroyed by fire the year before. Lunch will be served in the dining room overlooking the lake.

Friday September 27 Reception Cocktails & Dinner



The Friday evening reception cocktails and dinner will be held at Geneva Lake Museum. This unique and spectacular facility displays and preserves the rich history that hides throughout Geneva Lake and the surrounding communities. The exhibits within the walls are time capsules that capture every essence of Geneva Lake and its people; people with amazing stories that unravel with every scene and every word led by our knowledgeable quides.

Saturday September 28 Boat Show



Boats will be on exhibit all day Saturday, beginning at 10:00 am. Be sure you have your boat in the water by then, as we expect a lot of spectators. Local vendors will have items on display, and the Blackhawk Chapter's tent will once again offer t-shirts, posters and other items. The annual "starting of the engines" and boat parade will commence at 4:00 pm.

Where Are They Now?

I've grown up around wood boats all my life. My father is the proud owner of Fox River Valley Boat Company on the Fox River in McHenry, IL where since 1927 has been open to storing and restoring antique classic wooden boats. My grandfather had bought the business in 1968 and then passed it down to my father. I was never aware of the art and history behind any of them because it's what I had grown with, and I never believed there was really any other way to travel across water. As I grew older, I became more involved with the wooden boat community.

Father and son restore boats as labor of love

Growing up in such a community where you're surrounded by hard working adults and kids your age whose parents are so encouraging and willing to allow their children to try in new situations really makes you grow up a little faster. Being completely honest, I never saw myself going to college. I saw myself taking over the business like my father had taken over after my grandfather had passed away. Obviously God had other plans because I am currently a college student at the University of Wisconsin:

I joined the Blackhawk Youth Group when I was about 11, after many years of running around the boat shop. This opened my eyes to what my father really had done his whole life, and to what was a great influence on me as I grew older. I was put into an environment where I was able to meet some of my great friends all while working together to restore a beautiful piece of art. I've always look at wood boats as art, however, I never really considered my father or even my grandfather to have been artists. I can honestly say I look at the whole restoration process in a new light.



Whitewater. I am an Art Education Major, and am planning on minoring in Communications. Needless to say, I am beyond grateful for the experiences I've been able to work through this past year.

I entered the college environment expecting to go to class, make a few friends, and go home every weekend. That's not how it went at all. I began to meet many diverse people in every corner of campus and truly learned that I love people so much (much like my father). I lived for waking up and seeing the friends that become family in my residence hall. Many people had told me I would make a great Resident Assistant (or RA), and I was encouraged to join the Leadership Involvement Team (LIT) for my complex.



After planning programs to allow others to meet new people through their residence halls and helping with anything and everything I could, I was given a position as one of the representatives for my complex in the campus' Residence Hall Association (RHA). Before I knew it, I was shaking hands with some of the most well known students working in Residence Life, and building friendships with each of them. I also cannot explain the gratitude I feel towards my university having taught me what it means to be a leader, and then awarding me with a bronze pin for my leadership at the Reception of Excellence held by RHA at the end of the year.

My first year of college was wild, and I cannot wait to go back this fall. But for now, I am down at the marina helping my parents for the summer. It makes my heart happy thinking about how I grew up down here, and how I am able to still come back after being away. So many thanks to Mrs. Kathy Moberg and Mr. Terry Dickson for reaching out to me and giving me this opportunity to share how growing up in the wooden boat community has affected where I am today. In the end, I am happy I went off to college and I am so blessed to have parents who encouraged me to do so. I truly have grown so much from the experience.

Thank goodness Whitewater isn't too far from home. I will still see you all at boat shows very soon!
